Overview

We understand that getting an education is a significant financial undertaking, and our team is dedicated to helping make your dreams of attending America's first trade school a reality.

Our student body is diverse, and nearly 70% of current students receive some form of financial aid. What's more, we have frozen tuition at current levels and are on track to award over \$1,000,000 in NBSS scholarships annually to qualified students, making an education at NBSS more affordable than ever.



A note about student aid

Our student body is made up of recent high school graduates, former college students, and white-collar professionals. They are returning veterans, single parents, and recently married, starting new families.

Almost every student at NBSS is eligible for some type of aid, and each student receives a unique financial aid award.

Types of Aid

01 Grants & Scholarships

<u>Grants and scholarships</u> are often called "gift aid" because they are free money—financial aid that doesn't have to be repaid.

Grants and scholarships can come from the federal government, your state government, our <u>own NBSS funds</u>, or from private sources. Check out a list of private scholarships on our website <u>here</u>.





Types of Aid

02 Loans

A <u>loan</u> is money you borrow and must pay back with <u>interest</u>. Be sure to understand who is taking out the loan—you or your parents—and what responsibilities it brings.

Student loans can come from the <u>federal government</u>, <u>from private</u> lenders. Federal student loans generally have better terms than loans from banks or other private sources.





Types of Aid 03 VA Benefits

If you served in the U.S. military, you may be eligible for Veterans Administration education benefits, which can supplement other aid like grants and loans.

You can use <u>Post 9/11 G.I. Bill®</u>, <u>Chapter 33</u> or <u>Vocational and Rehabilitation Benefits</u>, <u>Chapter 31</u> towards our Full-Time Programs. VA benefits may also be applied to our Three-Month Furniture Making Intensive. <u>Learn more here.</u>







Affordability

To make an education at America's first trade school more affordable than ever, we just froze tuition, and expect to provide over \$650k in NBSS grants and scholarships to students this year.

<u>Initiative</u> provides 'full-cost' scholarships to high-need students in the greater
Boston area who experience barriers to employment.

Are you a veteran?

The <u>NBSS Yellow Ribbon Program</u> provides an annual grant to all veterans enrolling in one of our full-time programs.

Getting There

An educational financing plan can take many shapes, and typically includes a combination of resources. For example, your plan may include aid awarded through the NBSS Financial Aid Office, private loans and scholarships, state employment and/or rehabilitation benefits, personal savings, and/or Americorps funds.

How To Apply

- **01** | Complete the FAFSA application. Use NBSS code 015527.
- **02** | NBSS Scholarship consideration is automatic once you have completed the FAFSA.
- 03 | Apply and/or finish your Admissions Requirements.
- 04 | If a veteran, apply for benefits with the VA.
- 05 | Search for private scholarships.



Sample Aid Offers

The financial aid offers we provide our students are customized to your circumstances and financial eligibility. Check out a few examples of how our students have financed their education on the slides that follow.



Example 1

Furniture Maker

One year of aid for a student veteran receiving G.I. Bill benefits and an NBSS Yellow Ribbon Scholarship.

Total Aid	\$49,221
Federal Unsubsidized Direct Loan	\$6,000
Federal Subsidized Direct Loan	\$3,500
NBSS Yellow Ribbon Scholarship	\$1,600
Veterans' GI Bill Benefits	\$24,476
Federal Pell Grant	\$6,395
NBSS Scholarship	\$7,250

Example 2

Jewelry Maker

One year of aid for a student with significant financial need who already possesses a Bachelor's degree.

Total Aid	\$24,145
Federal Unsubsidized Direct Loan	\$6,000
Federal Subsidized Direct Loan	\$3,500
Private Scholarship	\$1,000
NBSS Pell Yes! Grant	\$6,395
NBSS Scholarship	\$7,250

Example 3

Carpenter

One year of aid for a student who qualifies for a full-tuition Workforce Initiative Scholarship.

Total Aid	\$38,395
Federal Unsubsidized Direct Loan	\$2,000
Federal Subsidized Direct Loan	\$3,500
Federal Pell Grant	\$6,395
NBSS Workforce Development	\$26,500
